Course Outline

Module 1 - Commerce in the Modern World

- Economic systems and conditions, commerce, business, law, statute, commercial law, jurisdiction
- Products, goods, services, utilities, intellectual property, trade, money and banking
- Transport, methods and features, auxiliary services, hospitality and accommodation
- Insurance, risks and losses, communication, printing, electronic communication

Module 2 - Nature and Classification of Law

- Description of a "legal system", sources of law, laws and legal systems in different countries
- Public, constitutional and criminal law, civil or private law, prosecutions and the burden of proof
- Commercial or business law, law of contract, formation of contracts, unwritten, written, void, voidable
- Elements of contracts, offer, acceptance, legal consequences, consideration, terms and conditions

Module 3 - Credit Transactions and Business Documents

- Transactions, credit, credit sales and purchases, cash flow and liquidity, working capital
- Types of credit, accounts, periods of credit, leasing, contract hire/rental, hire purchase, risks with credit
- Credit management, assessing applications, references, credit limits, credit control policy, customers
- Quotations, proformas, estimates, tenders, orders, invoices, receipts, statements of account, records

Module 4 - Legal Business Units and Ownership

- Sole trader businesses, registration and licencing, legal status, danger of unlimited liability
- Partnership firms, features, limited liability partnerships, partners, agreements, registration
- Companies, incorporation, shares, shareholders, limited liability, features, directors, ownership
- Memorandum of association, articles of association, companies limited by guarantee, guarantors

Module 5 - Financing of Companies and Law Relating to Company Directors

- Capital, revenue, expenditure, assets, liabilities, debtors, creditors, share capital, share certificates
- Acquisitions of shares, transfer of shares, shareholders' agreements, new shares issues
- Other methods of financing businesses, loans, lines of credit, bank overdraft, mortgages, debentures
- Company directors, registered office, annual returns, chairman, company secretary, legal duties, AGMs

Module 6 - Law of Tort Relating to Physical Products

- An "injury" in law, tort as a civil wrong, intentional, negligence and strict liability torts, the duty of care
- Products liability, privity of contract, tortious misrepresentation, fraud, breach of warranty, defects
- Burden of proof, the evidence, responsible parties, legal obligation, defences to products liability
- Consumer protection law, recovery for losses, negligence, harm, unsafe products, misconduct

Module 7 - Tort Law Relating to Services

- What services involve, types of services provided, service providers, tradesmen and professionals
- Defective services, duty of care by service providers, damages, claims for negligence and damages
- Direct, indirect and consequential loss, economic loss, non-visible financial loss, damage suffered
- Negligence in duty of care, negligent statements or misstatements, negligence by professionals

Module 8 - The Law of Agency

- Agency's role in business, how agency relationships arise, principal and agents, fiduciary relationship
- Types of agents, brokers, special agents, employees, independent contractors, bailees
- Creation of agency relationship, rights of an agent, duties of agents and principals to each other
- Termination of agency on agreement, lapse of time, in specified events, vicarious liability, bailments

Module 9 - Employment or Labour Law

- Employee responsibilities to employers, occupational health & safety, risk assessments
- Employer's obligations/duties to an employee, employer's duty of care, employer's liabilities in tort
- Employment contracts, contents, statute, custom, rules, agreements, trial periods, breaches of contract
- Statutory legislation, discrimination, equal opportunities, bullying, redundancy, legal actions

Module 10 - Principles and Law of Insurance

- Loss and losses, features of risks, insurance premiums, insurers and insurance cover, indemnity
- Insurance and law, proposals, insurance contracts, sum insured, utmost good faith, full disclosure
- Policy documents, proximate cause, underinsurance, subrogation, cover notes, certificates of insurance
- Types of insurance, compulsory, compensation, employers' liability, commercial, office, computer

Module 11 - Tort Liability for Premises

- Workplaces, property, occupiers, visitors, entrants, independent contractors, public liability insurance
- Premises liability, duty of care to lawful visitors, warning signs, features necessary to reduce liability
- Trespassers, easements, private and public nuisance, children, licensees, invitees, accidents
- Defences of premises liability, consent of the visitor, contributory negligence, exclusion of liability

Module 12 - Intellectual Property Protection

- Intellectual property, value, protection, rights, licencing agreements, franchising, international law
- Copyright, plagiarism, fraud, registration of copyrights, patents and trademarks, marks, signs, logos
- Industrial designs, geographical appellations, qualities, reputation and characteristics
- Infringement of IP rights, passing off, falsehood, breach of confidence, lawyers, computer data
